

HELD at gunpoint five times, locked up in 16 prisons at home and abroad, two failed jail-breaks, befriended by psychopaths and caught trafficking drugs - his life reads like the plot of a thriller movie.

But for one Welshman, these are the experiences he is reliving as he finally tells the tale of his extraordinary life.

Former international drugs runner Alan "Dogs" Jones so-called because he is never seen without his Sealyham Terrier, Dylan, at his side - has decided to pen his autobiography three decades after serving a jail sentence in North Africa and Spain for smuggling cannabis

The 68-year-old, who has spent nearly 10 years in prison overall, today reveals to Wales on Sunday how he went from being a talented schoolboy rugby player in the Valleys to carrying hash worth up to £90,000 across Europe and Africa in the 1970s

He said it has taken him almost 30 years to write about his experiences because of the traumatic memories of fellow cons committing suicide and older inmates raping younger prisoners while he was being held in Spain.

he staged his first escape attempt, trying to blow up the prison kitchen as a di version. Shortly afterwards he led 10 other prisoners in an escape attempt - and received a savage beating.

He said: "After the first [escape] attempt obviously they couldn't trust me, or the other Europeans as well They put us all in a dormitory mainly for the Spanish lads. It was from there that

"We had collected quite a few sheets and blankets enough to make a rope. My friend went up on the wall and got shot at. He fell over the other side of the wall and all hell broke loose

"We rushed back through the bars. Minutes after that the door burst open and in came the guards. They had a good idea that it was us. They took everybody out down to the patio and lined us up. There was one Spanish guy pointing the finger at me. He made me the ringleader, which I was. They surrounded me with rifle butts, truncheons and dogs and then beat the s*** out of me.'

He was moved around prisons on the Spanish mainland during his seven-year sentence, which he saw reduced after he took on the role of psychiatric nurse to criminally-insane patients in Carabanchel prison, Madrid. Alan administered medication to the prisoners.

One of the killers housed at Carabanchel was Manuel Delgado Villegas, convicted for murdering eight people and also said by Spanish police to have practised necrophilia on his victims.

I got the shock of my life when I found out how many people he killed," said Alan. Following his release in February 1982, Alan returned to Britain. But it is only now - after 28 years of stability with partner Susan Bibey - he has felt it possible to sit down with co-author Anita Child and write No Half Measures. The book is as yet without a publisher. "Seeing the book on the shelf would
